2012 Summer Reading Program

Children from 0 to 18 years had been invited to participate in the 2012 Summer Reading Program at Bibliothèque Saint-Joachim Library. One hundred and twenty-two children registered for the program which included weekly crafts, and French and English story times and games every Wednesday morning. Children were encouraged to fill out tickets for every book read. The totals were tallied and by the end of the summer, 74 of the participants had read the minimum required to be eligible for prizes and 2796 reading tickets had been returned. This total of books tickets submitted is 190 % compared to 2011.

The wind up celebrations for the 2012 program took place on August 23. The eligible participants and their families had been invited to a noontime BBQ and around 100 people attended. Following this, the participants were invited into the library and were able to choose a prize according to the number of books each had read. Everyone received a prize, and most seemed quite pleased to be able to walk away with a token for the effort they had made to read as many books as possible over the summer. A goody bag was also distributed to all the participants.
